

Possibilities for club grant program

- Expand Larry's List, with the object of increasing local membership, supporting new hams, and providing educational materials. *Probably not realistic, as Larry's List has become self-sustaining.*
- Establish a radio club at a local college, probably Johnson County Community College, possibly Metropolitan CC, Penn Valley, or one of the several technical institutions. *Discussed after the meeting with Tom Wheeler, NOGSG, who teaches at JCCC, and Jamie Charlton, ADOAB who teaches at MetroCC. They both cited the major obstacle as being a complete lack of interest among their young students. Johnson County RAC suggested having a meeting at JCCC to drum up interest. JCCC would probably support it, as would MetroCC, but the first requirement for a club is interested students. Which we don't have.*
- Underwrite and support an amateur radio station at the WW1 Museum and Memorial (WW1USA). Use it to support STEM education in the local schools. *There was significant enthusiasm for this. Charles Van Way will meet with museum executives, and report back to 4th quarter meeting.*
- Purchase and support a club station for MOKAN itself (see discussion below about club call sign). *The discussion noted that the Foundation puts equipment purchase as the lowest priority item, and so would be unlikely to support this.*
- Establish activities within one of the area school systems to promote amateur radio as part of STEM education. Possibilities would be KCMO Public Schools, Shawnee Mission, Blue Valley, KCK-Wyandotte County public schools, and North Kansas City. *Same problem as the community colleges, a lack of interest. Also, we have no one who is directly involved in teaching or administration at the high school level.*
- Identify underserved areas in rural Missouri and Kansas within 50 miles of Kansas City and recruit local hams to establish radio clubs in rural areas. *The Foundation was negative on this possibility when we submitted a grant in 2022. It seems unlikely that it will look favorably on this.*
